### Other incidental costs that may arise throughout the year:

**Fete (term 1)**– families can contribute to baking at our cake stalls or donating goods. We provide storage containers for free. **Raffle Tickets** – books are sold for \$20 each. **Kris Kringle gifts** - each staff and student gives a gift to the value of \$5 - \$10. **Impromptu Opportunities** - are times when opportunities for excursions or incursions arise that are too good to miss out on. Our standard travel is \$10 per student plus additional entry costs. **Special Lunch Order Days** –eg soup, hot dog, sausage sizzles, pizza. **Student Leader Fundraising Events** – Our leaders hold special fundraisers to raise money (for charities or for the school) throughout the year which will require donations and could include dressing up. **Book Week Dress Up Day** – students come dressed as a book character.

# PARENT PAYMENTS POLICY

## ONE PAGE OVERVIEW



### FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



### PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

#### Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

#### Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

#### Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



### FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



### SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
